Terms of Reference

Quality of Life at Work Committee

Montreal Children's Hospital & Women's Health Mission

1. Purpose

The Quality of Life at Work Committee (QLWC) exists to foster a positive, inclusive, and engaging work environment for all staff of the Montreal Children's Hospital and the Women's Health Mission. The committee achieves this by organizing a variety of staff appreciation events throughout the year that promote well-being, team spirit, and recognition of staff contributions.

2. Scope of Activities

The QLWC is responsible for planning, organizing, and executing **8–10 staff appreciation events annually**, which may include but are not limited to:

- Summer Party
- Halloween Celebration
- December Holiday Party
- Themed events (e.g., wellness days, staff recognition days)

Events are designed to be inclusive and accessible to all staff, and to reflect the diversity and values of the hospital community.

3. Membership

- Membership is open to all staff of the Montreal Children's Hospital and Women's
 Health Mission who are interested in contributing to the planning and/or execution of
 events.
- Members can participate in some or all the following ways (minimum 2 ways): brainstorming, planning and organizing events, event set-up, event take-down, animation during the event
- A Chair or Co-Chairs will be selected to coordinate meetings and liaise with various hospital departments.

4. Meetings

- The committee will meet **monthly**, or more frequently as needed, especially in the lead-up to major events.
- Meetings may be held in person or virtually to accommodate members' schedules.

5. Budget and Resources

- The committee's activities are **funded by the Montreal Children's Hospital** Foundation.
- The committee is responsible for preparing event budgets and ensuring responsible use of funds.
- Requests for funding or reimbursements must follow the Foundation's financial procedures and must follow the Externally Restricted Funds policy.

6. Reporting and Accountability

- The QLWC reports to the **Operations (OPS) Committee** of the Montreal Children's Hospital.
- A brief summary of activities, outcomes, and budget usage will be submitted to the OPS Committee and/or the Montreal Children's Hospital Foundation upon request.

7. Review

- These Terms of Reference will be reviewed bi-annually to ensure they remain relevant and effective.
- Amendments may be proposed by any committee member and must be approved by consensus.
